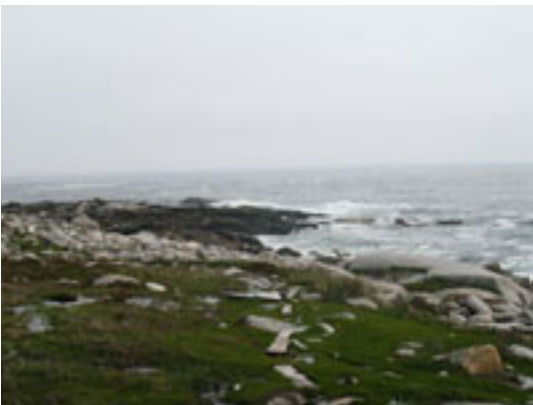


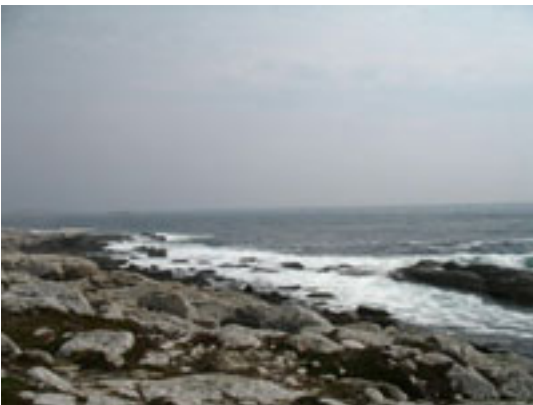




## Path to the High Head
